FACULTY PRESENTERS

DR. EDWINA MAKSYM

Dr. Maksym recently served as Academic Dean and a member of the history faculty at Montrose School. In her twenty years as an educator and administrator, she has taught English, history, philosophy and theology. She lectures widely both here and abroad on the Four Temperaments. Dr. Maksym earned her undergraduate degree in English from Emmanuel College and both her master's and PhD from the University of Maryland College Park.

Ms. O'Donovan taught at Montrose School for thirteen years before retiring in 2002. In her long and fruitful educational career, she taught in public and private, urban and suburban schools. She has a MAT in English from Boston University and has taught philosophy and English for over twenty-five years. She is a Dante and C.S. REVEREND JOSEPH RUISANCHEZ

Father Joseph served as chaplain at Montrose School for five years. He is a priest of the Priestly Society of the Holy Cross and Opus Dei.
